We all learnt that to preserve our planet we need to adopt sustainable practices. The assembly was a great learning experience for all of us and enlightened us to many ways in which we can use it.

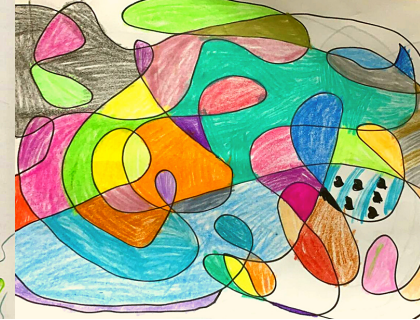
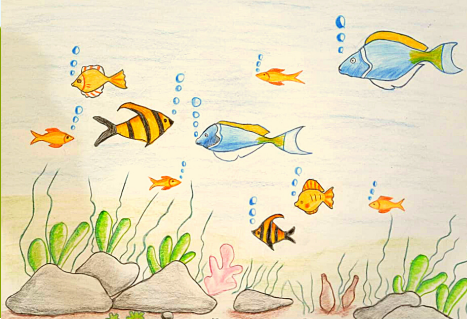
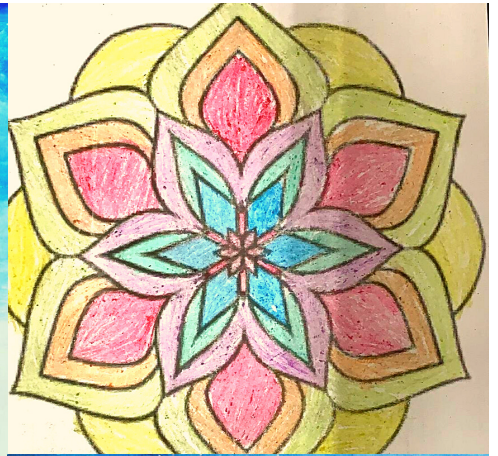
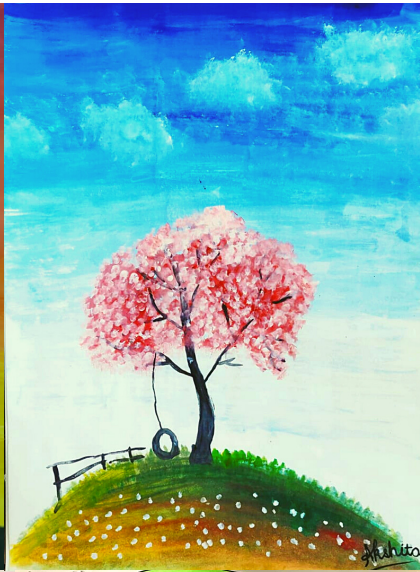

Just then, the computer started beeping, "Attention! Massive object nearby!"

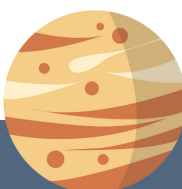

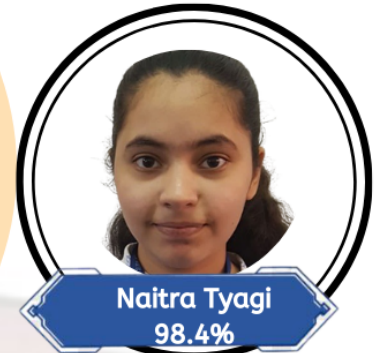
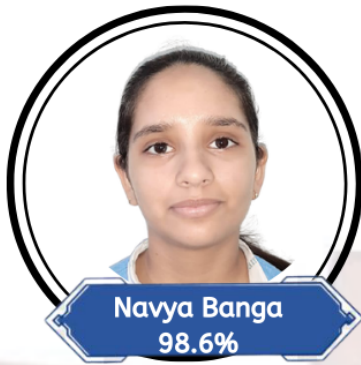
