Each art form has its own charm and historical significance. Please choose one of the following folk art forms that resonates with you for the Grade I-V events.

Here's a brief overview of each art form:



Kalamkari Paintings

Hand-painted or block-printed fabric art from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, showcasing mythological stories with intricate lines, patterns, and shapes.

Madhubani Paintings
Bright and detailed designs from Bihar, traditionally
made by women, illustrating mythology and nature
with vibrant patterns and shapes.





#### **Phad Paintings**

Phad Painting: Long scrolls from Rajasthan depicting stories of deities and heroes through bold lines, colourful patterns, and dynamic shapes.





### Pattachitra Art

Detailed mythological scenes from Odisha and West Bengal, created on cloth or palm leaves with fine lines, natural colours, and geometric shapes.

### Kalighat Pat Art

Vibrant Kolkata paintings on cloth or paper, featuring playful lines, patterns, and shapes to depict everyday life and myths with humour.

Tribal art from Madhya Pradesh, known for bright colours, dot patterns, and abstract shapes to depict animals, plants, and mythical beings.
