Dharaa Khare of Grade XI was recognised among the Top Changemakers at the **1M1B Changemakers World Cup 2025**, securing a place in the Top 50 globally and ranking 24th individually. **Janhavi Batra and Nishtha Aswal** were also featured in the Top 50, securing the 36th position in the team category, while **Ritvika Yadav** was recognised among the Top 200, ranking 111th individually.

We are proud to highlight exceptional individual achievements at national and international platforms. **Prachi Verma** brought global recognition to the school by winning the **Most Popular Award** at **UNESCO’s Quantum Light: A Visual Odyssey** for her creation *“The Hidden Artwork of the Universe*.

Aadya Vaishtha was selected for the prestigious **INSPIRE–MANAK Award**, an initiative of the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, for her innovative project **Ethylene Scavenger Storage Box**, and received a grant of 10,000 to develop her idea further.

As a first-of-its-kind initiative in our journey, the centre welcomes both girls and boys, extending our commitment to early childhood education and creating a strong foundation for lifelong learning.

Our students continued to excel at national and international academic platforms.

In the **International Science Olympiad**, Priyal Kaushik of grade 5C distinguished herself by securing the **Gold Medal of Distinction**.

And in the Hindi Olympiad, Myra Tomar of grade 5C has also got the **Gold Medal of Distinction**.

In the **Edujunior International Essay Writing Competition**, Saanvi Arora of grade 5A secured the **Second Position** and a **Silver Medal** along with a **Certificate of Excellence**.

Adding to these individual accomplishments, **Mayra Singh of grade 1A secured the First Prize in the District-Level Geeta Chanting Competition organised by Chinmaya Mission**, bringing laurels to the school.

STEM Education and Scientific Temper

One of the defining features of learning at Uttam School for Girls is the emphasis on **STEM education—Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics**.

Our students participated in the **Avishkaar League 2025–26**, a national innovation platform focusing on robotics, coding, artificial intelligence, and game design. Demonstrating exceptional creativity and teamwork, they advanced to the National Finale, earning the **Outstanding Team Spirit Award** along with special recognition in the **Girls in STEM** category.

To celebrate **National Science Day**, our Primary Wing became a hub of discovery. From building electrical circuits and exploring the phases of the moon to experimenting with the **Raman Effect** and the wonders of our solar system, we brought science to life through hands-on learning.

Students from Grades 3 to 5 also participated in **eRaksha 2025**, an initiative by **CyberPeace** and **NCERT**, where they explored the theme **“AI for Peace and Safety”**.

The school’s **Robotics Club** further strengthens technological learning, enabling students to design and program robots using block-based coding.

Literacy and Numeracy

The **CBSE Budding Authors Programme** provides a unique platform where students conceptualise and publish their own stories, nurturing creativity and imagination.
