BONDS BEYOND BORDERS

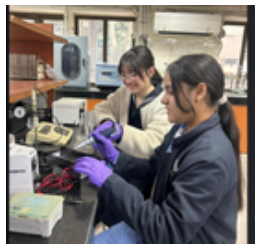
GERMAN IMMERSION PROGRAMME

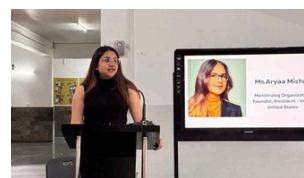
CELEBRATING THE SPIRIT OF LITERAURE- JONQUIL 5.0

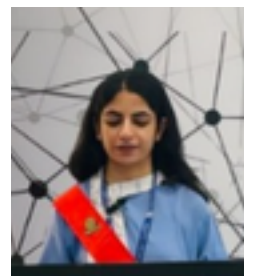
SHUBHAASHIRWAAD
